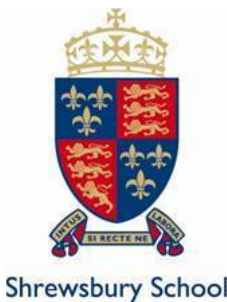

Dear Parent,

This letter comes to say that we are looking forward very much to welcoming your son to Shrewsbury in September. This is a vibrant and friendly community and we will do all we can to ensure that he feels a valued part of it as quickly as possible.

I am conscious that the world continues to travel through extraordinary times and that thinking further ahead than a few weeks is far from straightforward. However, we have managed to operate safely and successfully this year, both in person and in remote, and we are excited at the prospect of starting the new academic year in September.

You will shortly be hearing from your Housemaster. He will write to you to explain various elements of routine, so that you can begin to 'tune in' to House life, which is so central to the Salopian experience, and also to learn about the induction process for new entrants to the school.

Since the Housemaster, supported by his Assistant Housemaster, House Matron and a team of tutors, has over-all responsibility for the welfare of the members of his House, it is with him that you will be most closely in contact, and he is your first port of call when questions arise.

This gives a summary of the aims of a Shrewsbury Education and the Salopian Virtues and Character Strengths we are seeking to develop as we care for your son.

There may, however, be occasions when you have concerns or issues that you would like to discuss directly with me, in which case please do not hesitate to contact my PA, Mrs Fiona Nicholas (fnicholas@shrewsbury.org.uk) to arrange a telephone call.

The **Fasti**, our school calendar, is published on the school website at www.shrewsbury.org.uk and there you will find the dates of concerts, plays, sporting fixtures, lectures and Chapel Services. When the social distancing rules have been relaxed, and it is safe to do so, you will be most welcome to attend any of these occasions. We greatly value the opportunity to meet parents and hope you will enjoy excellent contact with the school. **Dates Ahead**, including Exeats and the extended weekends, are enclosed so that you are able to plan your year in advance.

The **Yellow Card** covers issues to do with Welfare. It sets out on paper a framework of encouragement, expectations and rules, which we will go through with your son shortly after arrival, ensuring that he feels secure in his knowledge of how we operate. If there is any aspect of the card which you wish to discuss, then your son's Housemaster will be only too happy to talk to you. We realise that no single document can hope to cover everything and we are well aware that the greater part of our life at Shrewsbury depends on mutual trust, honesty and common sense.

The school has a wide range of documentation available on its website, including the following:

- The School Complaints Procedure (together with a note of the number of complaints registered under the formal procedure during the past academic year)

The school website also includes details of last year's public examination results, and a list of the teaching staff with their qualifications.

Finally, I would like to draw your attention to the important information from the Deputy Head Academic, which I would urge you to read carefully. At this point, there is just one curriculum choice to be taken by you and your son: if he wishes to study Greek, you will need to return the proforma.

In future years other academic subject choices will be taken at various stages in your son's career – concerning GCSE options and Sixth Form subjects, for example. Full information will be sent to you at the appropriate time in preparation for those decisions. I also enclose a statement about our Learning Support Department and our policy for pupils for whom English is an Additional Language.

My colleagues and I very much look forward to future opportunities to meet you, as your son progresses through what we hope and expect to be an enjoyable, challenging and successful time at Shrewsbury School.

We will be in touch closer to the time of your son's arrival at the school, but please do not hesitate to make contact with his Housemaster if you have any further questions. We are here to help.
