The Shrewsbury School Foundation was created in 1965 by Trust Deed and has now assisted Shrewsbury School for over fifty years. The Foundation raises funds to provide essential bursarial support for talented pupils, who could not otherwise afford the fees to be educated at Shrewsbury, and assists the School with a variety of important capital projects.

In the 2018-2019 financial year the Foundation's priorities were to refocus on raising funds to support bursaries and to complete the fundraising for the much needed redevelopment of the Ashton Theatre.

I am delighted to present the Shrewsbury School Foundation's 2018/19 annual report. This was a very active period during which the Foundation achieved some considerable successes.

Firstly, through the outstanding generosity of many Salopians and parents, and Sir David and Lady Barnes, the Foundation has completed the funding for the school's new theatre, which will be named in honour of Sir David and Lady Barnes. Construction of this world-class facility began the day after the end of the summer term 2019 and will undoubtedly contribute tremendously to improving the teaching and experience of drama and the performing arts at the school. For all those who have played a role in this funding effort, please accept my heartfelt thanks and huge appreciation.

As I am sure you are all aware, as the oldest school foundation in the country, the Shrewsbury School Foundation has a long-standing tradition of bursarial support, which we are now seeking to develop further. Bursaries for qualified means-tested pupils are more highly in demand today than ever before. As such I am pleased to report that last year the Foundation raised over £615,000 for bursaries, which is a significant uplift from previous years. This was an outstanding achievement given that the Foundation was simultaneously engaged in fundraising for the theatre, the fourth phase of our long-running capital campaign.

As the Foundation moves from strength to strength, I do hope you will join me in celebrating our achievements, as the funds raised through your charitable support markedly improve the ability of Shrewsbury School to deliver the finest education to our pupils.

## Thanking our donors

It is important to the Foundation that all those who make a gift are thanked for their generosity. All gifts benefit teaching and learning at Shrewsbury School and combined make a real difference. Our donors' support enables capital projects to be completed and talented pupils who could not otherwise afford the fees, to be educated here.

### Annual Giving Societies

Many of the Foundation's loyal supporters have given over many years, and so the Foundation has created these societies to recognise their commitment based on their total giving.

Member: total giving £1,000 or more

Fellow: total giving £10,000 or more

Charter Fellow: total giving £50,000 or more

Founder Fellow: total giving £100,000 or more

Benefactor: total giving £250,000 or more

Patron: total giving £1 million or more.

Those whose total giving is £10,000 or more will be invited to have their name added to the donor wall in the foyer of the Alington Hall.

Donors are also invited to events during the year to thank them for their commitment and generosity. Depending on the level of giving, the Foundation holds receptions and openings, offers ticket to the School Carol Service, holds dinners for Fellows and invites donors to sporting events such as Henley and also music and theatrical events.

## 1552 Society

The 1552 Society is named after the year that the School was founded by Royal Charter and was formed to enable the Foundation and Shrewsbury School to thank those who have made provision for Shrewsbury School in their will. To recognise their support all members of the Society are invited to an annual event at the school and receive a specially commissioned lapel pin.

By leaving a gift in your will you can help to ensure that future generations will be able to benefit from a Shrewsbury education, as you or your children did. As Shrewsbury School Foundation is a registered charity, leaving a legacy means that not only will the school benefit from your gift, but the tax burden levied on your estate will be reduced.

Membership of the 1552 Society is offered to all those who let us know that they have arranged to include a bequest to Shrewsbury in their will. There are currently just over 100 members and in 2018-2019 the Foundation received just under £30,000 in legacy gifts.

# Summary of Annual Giving 2018-2019

The Foundation is tasked with raising at least £550,000 a year for the Annual Fund. We are delighted to report that in 2018-2019 this goal was surpassed and £776,924.08 was raised in cash gifts and new pledges (excluding funds raised for the Capital Campaign).

Old Salopians, parents and friends gave primarily to the following areas:

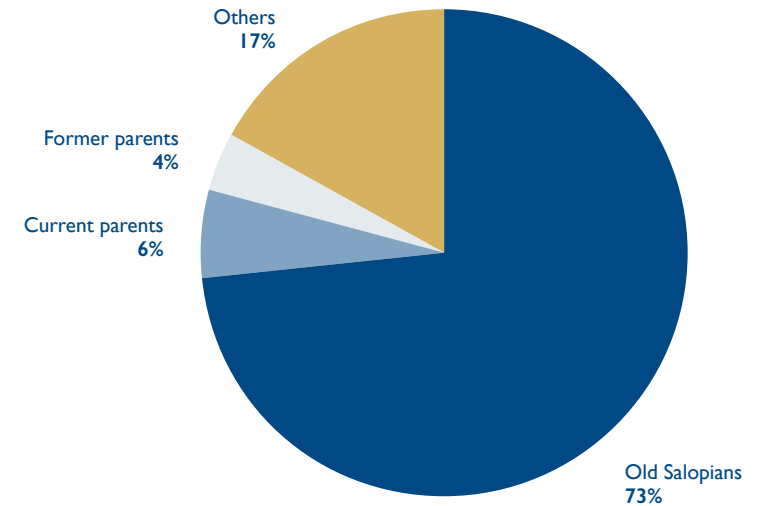
**Bursaries:** Over £615,000 was raised in cash gifts and pledges for bursaries, 79% of the total funds raised. This has helped us to maintain our commitment to bursaries for qualified means tested pupils. As many are regular donations, this will also help us to plan for future bursary provision.

**Unrestricted gifts/Whole School Fund:** Almost £100,000 was donated to be allocated to the area of greatest need as determined by the Headmaster and Governors, giving the greatest flexibility in how these much needed funds are used.

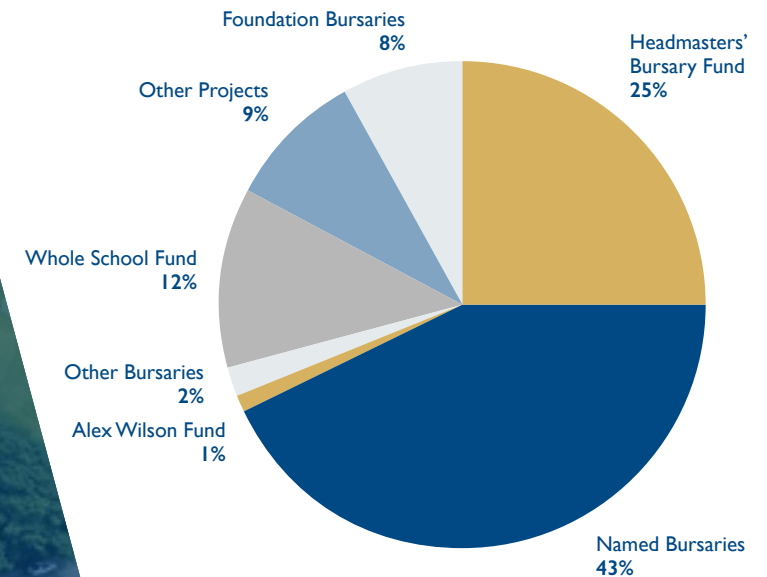
**Projects:** Donors gave to projects such as pastoral care, rowing and art.

In addition to support for the annual fund, donors gave to Shrewsbury's Capital Campaign projects, primarily the redevelopment of the Ashton Theatre.

## Redevelopment of the Theatre

The Foundation is delighted to report that the charitable funding of the theatre was completed in April and work on the project commenced during the summer break. Over the coming months the theatre will be redeveloped and extended with the addition of a grand new multipurpose foyer, above which will be two large classrooms one with a state-of-the-art sprung dancefloor.



This game-changing new facility will benefit not just those interested in or studying drama, but the whole school community. Not only will dramatic productions be on show in the theatre, but its uses will be many and varied. It will be used for public speaking competitions, debating, open days, staff training, public lectures and visiting speakers, as well as outreach and community engagement projects.



### Sir David Barnes (R 1949-54)

*“During my time at Shrewsbury very little attention was given to the performing arts. With hindsight that lack of support was all the more surprising given the emergent trend towards satire from pupils such as Richard Ingrams, Willie Rushton, Paul Foot and others that was to form the core of programmes such as “That Was the Week That Was”. Paul Dehn’s production of “Call-Over”, a Masque to celebrate the school’s fourth centenary, highlighted the importance of the performing arts. In short, the talent and interest were there, but not the necessary platform.*

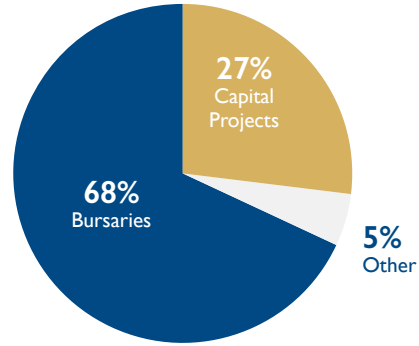
*But that was then and this is now! In more recent times Shrewsbury has led independent schools artistically. It has taken many of its productions to the Edinburgh Fringe, including the remarkable “Jekyll” which gained a Fringe First Award in 1995, the only school to have achieved such recognition.*

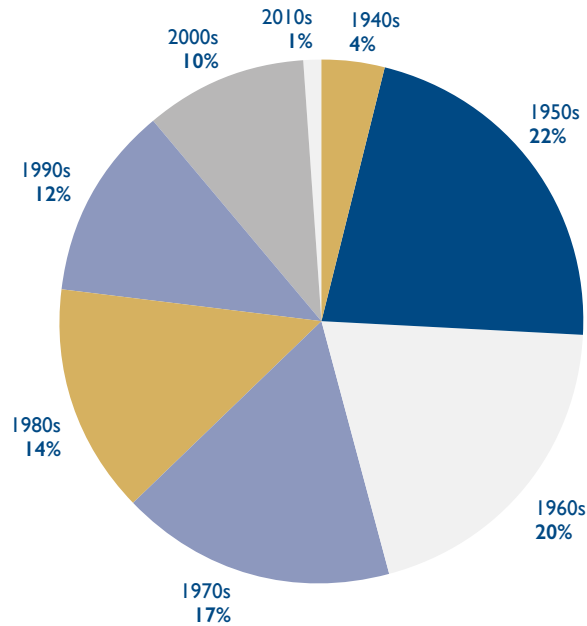

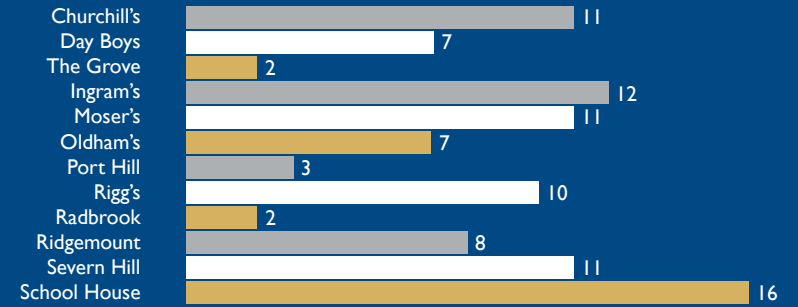

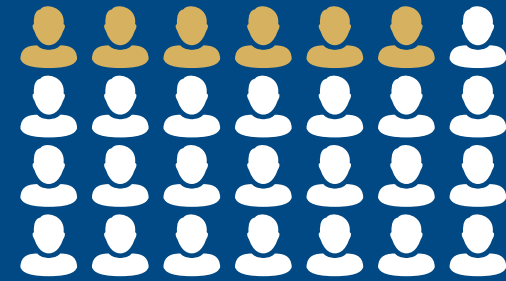
## Old Salopian Donors by Decade at School



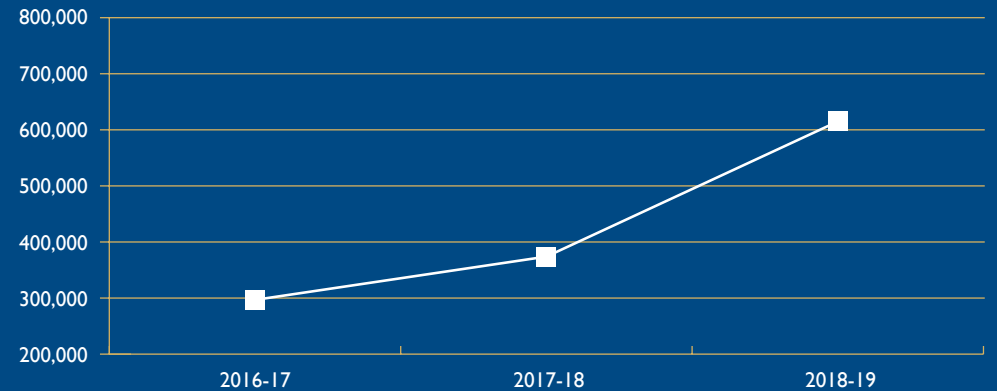
## Percentage of Old Salopian Donors by House

## Bursaries

A bursary can be a life-changing opportunity for a pupil who could not otherwise access a Shrewsbury education.

The Shrewsbury School Foundation continues to play a vital role in the provision of bursaries.

Each year the bursaries awarded through your charitable support are increasingly for a higher percentage of overall fees. Support can be provided up to 110% of fees depending on a pupil's level of need. As many know, through our donors' generosity, bursaries help Shrewsbury to attract the best and brightest. It is through the provision of bursaries that our Headmaster is able to select the pupils that best benefit our pupil population.

As demand for bursaries increases, the Foundation is committed to increasing the level of bursary funding available. In 2018-19, with the tremendous support of our donors, £615,568 was raised in new gifts and pledges, well over the target for the year. This tremendous achievement is in addition to annual funding that was directed to the Whole School Fund, projects and endowment.
