We are gathered tonight to toast the Saracens centenary. The Shrewsbury Saracens were formed towards the end of the 1925 cricket season; on latter pages Dr Robin Brooke-Smith will elaborate on the club's formation and the founding fathers, we also have some wonderful photos and club artefacts from those early years.

Will Hughes, the school Director of Cricket and Adam Shantry, one of the school's professional coaches have provided us with an insight into the recent school cricket successes and ambitions. The bond between the school and the Saracens needs to be resolute and the quality of cricket and cricketers coming out of the school remains very impressive.

This booklet also lists those who have held roles within the Saracens hierarchy and those who have represented clubs and country. We highlight the Cricketer Cup victories, we share some photos from the years of touring including sociable trips to Epernay in 1977 and 1987 and Barbados in 2001.



Next year we will celebrate 100 years of touring the North Devon CC and plans are being made for this celebration in mid-August. # Shrewsbury Saracens: Foundation & Early Years

Towards the end of the Summer Term of 1925, following the Old Salopian match against the Schools in July, a group of OS's, including two Masters (Mitford and Tombling) and one future Headmaster (Peterson), 'decided to form a club to be known as the Old Salopian Cricket Club'.

Rules of the Club were drafted and sent to 66 Old Salopians, whose names are recorded in the Saracens Album (in the School Archives). The Rules laid out the club's constitution and, among other things, the club colours of Maroon, Gold and Royal Blue were instituted. Lord Rochdale was elected President and A.F. Chance (Master) as Vice President.

In the 1926 season they played six games, five of which were two day matches and the match against the school was a three day game, oh happy expansive days. The first of many fixture cards was printed with the playing season running from 3 July to 12 August. This first season saw matches against J de R Phillp's XI (Dunchurch), Gents of Worcester, Shrewsbury School, Northern Nomads, Gents of Shropshire, and North Devon CC.

In December 1926 the annual committee meeting, held at the school, decided to rename the club Shrewsbury Saracens Cricket Club. Why 'the Saracens' is not recorded.



Right from the start in 1926 the match against North Devon became part of a long standing and much loved summer tour of Devon and Somerset.

The Saracens Minute Book (1927 - 58), held in the School Archives, begins with the 1927 AGM at No 40 the Schools at

which R Sale was Chairman. And so, the club was on its way to playing magnificent cricket, on the incomparable Common and elsewhere to the great delight of many generations of players, spectators, scorers, umpires, and groundsman. The photo opposite shows Alington, Lord Rochdale, the Bishop of Chester, and Canon Sawyer watching a game in the early days.

The club thrived greatly during the 20's and 30's, but from 1940 - 46 no meetings were held owing to the war, but members of the committee on the school staff kept a skeleton committee going; there is no mention of games being played during the war.

The 50's, 60's and 70's saw a golden age of cricket with the 'Saracens Week' held every year in the last week of July immediately after the end of term, and of course the Devon Tour in August. Among the galaxy of great players from this



period, in my memory the following stand out: Guy Thornycroft, Robin Moulsdale, Nicko Williams, Geoffrey Phillips, Rev Hugh Brook, not forgetting the great umpire, Laurence Le Quesne, who raised his finger with famous alacrity! Others will have to tell the story of more recent years of Saracens Cricket.

# Cricket at Shrewsbury School in 2025



Our pupils are able to access our state-of-the-art four lane cricket centre all year round. It features full length run ups, and houses four Bola bowling machines and a Merlyn spin bowling machine.

The nets are fully retractable to enable fielding practices, with new LED lighting providing perfect conditions for play.

4 top-quality cricket squares are used seven days a week in the summer. We have 10 outdoor grass nets, as well as mobile cages to facilitate middle practices. Our 1st XI pitch features a scoreboard capable of instant action replays, and the home dressing room benefits from a big screen showing a live feed of the game.

#### Coaching Programme

The winter programme includes a wide range of 1:1, small group, and squad coaching sessions, with around 80 such practices taking place each week during the winter.

Our highly qualified coaches boast a wealth of experience in both in the professional and recreational game and are well placed to offer advice and guidance



to our pupils. During the summer our 'A' teams train 3 times per week alongside their fixtures, in addition to participating in a vibrant House Cricket programme.

#### Fixture and Touring Programme

We play over 300 fixtures in a full season, with pre and post-season festivals for boys and girls. As well as playing other leading schools our teams take on county opposition from Warwickshire, Worcestershire and Glamorgan. Our fixture list includes a blend of red ball, white ball, pink ball, and 2-day cricket, with multiple county and national cup ties.

We embark on overseas tours on a 2-year cycle, recent destinations include Cape Town, Australia and Dubai. Pupils benefit from both a cricketing and cultural education while challenging themselves against some of the best cricketing schools in the world.

#### Professional Cricketers / Internationals

Since the Cricket Centre was built in 2004, 13 players have signed county contracts, with James Taylor and Issy Wong going on to earn full international status.

In 2024, 3 of our pupils attained U19 International status: Theo Wylie (England U19), Jack Home (England U19), and Freddie Ogilby (Ireland U19). Theo also represented his country at the ICC U19 World Cup while still studying at Shrewsbury.

#### **National Titles**

Shrewsbury have twice won the HMCT20 competition, and in 2022 and 2023 became the first side to retain the U17 Cricket Paper Trophy in the competition's history. The Girls 1st XI won the Cricket Paper 100 Ball Cup in 2021.



#### **Key Partners**

Worcestershire and Glamorgan both run Satellite Academy programmes led by school staff, while we have close ties with many other counties. Cheshire's bond with Shrewsbury now sees them feed into the Glamorgan pathway, while we also host training camps for ECB national squads. Shropshire Cricket Board base their winter training programme at School, while the MCC run a regional hub, and in the summer we host numerous County age group fixtures.

#### Holistic Development

As well as a first-class cricketing experience, our programme is enhanced by a multitude of additional features including strength and conditioning training, yoga and team-building excursions.





#### Salopian Cricket for Life

We are hugely grateful to the Saracens for their ongoing support to Shrewsbury School cricket. Each year two Saracens sides travel to Shrewsbury for a 1st and 2nd XI fixture. The Saracens' Cricketer Cup home games take place on Senior where the honours board in the Top of Shop highlights their achievements.

Generous donations from several Saracens helped fund the indoor cricket centre which has enabled generations of Salopians to benefit from year-round practice facilities, as well as very generous financial contributions to our overseas touring programme which broadens access to the tours. Great interest is regularly shown in the school's social media feeds, where Old Salopians take huge pride in the current pupil's successes.

U6th Leavers are encouraged to join the Saracens and to go on the Devon tour and numbers have been healthy in recent years.


# 1977 Cricketer Cup Winners

#### RULES

- 1. The affairs of Strewsbury Saracens are to be regulated by a President; Vice-Presidents, and a Committee.
- 2 The Committee shall consist of the Hon, Secretary and not more than twelve members to be elected by a majority of votes of Saracens at the annual Meeting.
- 3. The duties of the Committee are to assist the Son. Secretary in arranging matches, to elect Saracens, and generally to forward the interest of the Club among Old Salopian cricketins.
- 4. Candidates for election are to be Old Salopians, or Members of the Staff at the School, and shall be required to play two qualifying matches, which the Committee reserve the right to dispense with in special cases.
- 5 lipplication for qualifying matches are to be made by a Saracen on behalf of a Candidate to the Son. Secretary.
- 6 Fach landidate for election is to be proposed by a Member of the Committee and seconded by a Saracen, and shall be elected by a Majority of votes at a Committee meeting.
- 7 Fach ready-elected Saracen shall pay 20/- to the Hon Secretary for postage and printing. (altered to 40/- in 1930)
  There shall be no annual subscription.
- 8 The Club Colours Shall be Maroon, Gold, and Royal Blue, which can only be obtained from E.F. Afford. Shrewsbury.
- 9 The expenses of a match (Umpires and Scores) shall be divided amongst those playing. The Manager of a match to be responsible that no debts are incurred by the Club.
- 10 These rules shall only be altered at a General Meeting after one months notice of the alteration given to the Hon Secretary.
