Upper 6th

- Welcome to your final year at Shrewsbury School! It is an exciting year for you and there is plenty of support available, with the UCAS afternoon booked on Thursday 9th September one of many activities designed to provide you with opportunity to consider your options.
- If you are intending to progress to university for the next academic year, it is important you are aware of the deadlines to submit your application. For competitive applications in the United Kingdom (e.g. medicine, Oxbridge), the school internal deadline is Friday 1st October. For applications to other institutions and courses in the UK, applications needs to be submitted by Friday 5th November. If you are intending to apply to a university outside of the UK, and have not let Mr Percival know, can you do so as a matter of urgency so you can access the support you need.
- If you are applying, you should be on your way to drafting a personal statement by this point. If you are struggling for inspiration, you might find this <u>resource</u> and this <u>video</u> of use.
- If you are planning to have a gap year and need support with planning this, please make contact so we can do our best to help.
- You may be interested in pursuing a degree apprenticeship. Please contact me if you are and I will talk you through this process. You can apply to a degree apprenticeship alongside a university application. PWC have just released their offer in this field for 2022, have a read <u>here</u>.
- If you are completely unsure about what your next steps will be, please contact the Futures Department for further advice and guidance.

First up, we are focusing on sport, with Loughborough University talking through degree opportunities in this area on Monday 20th September (during societies hour) and then on Tuesday 21st September we are joined (7:30pm) on zoom by two professionals in this field. An early look at this <u>site</u> suggests a blended delivery in the coming weeks in regards to these events, with the gradual return of site visits for some (but not all) institutions.
