Upper Sixth UCAS Update

The vast majority of upper sixth have completed their university applications and are beginning to receive some offers. Mr Percival will circulate details in the next fortnight confirming what you need to do in terms of responding to these offers. If you have decided over the Christmas break to apply but are yet to commence your application, can I politely request that you alert either Mr Percival or I as a matter of urgency.

Degree Apprenticeships

Even if you have applied to university, there is nothing to stop you pursuing some of the degree apprenticeship opportunities that are increasing in numbers for a September 2022 start. As a reminder, these are work based opportunities, where you spend most of your time with your employer earning a full time wage, and part of your time with a linked higher education provider gaining your degree. Your employer pays your tuition fees and you are almost always guaranteed a job at the end of the programme. I have included a couple of examples below to provide a flavour of positions which you could apply for, advertised on the UCAS site.
